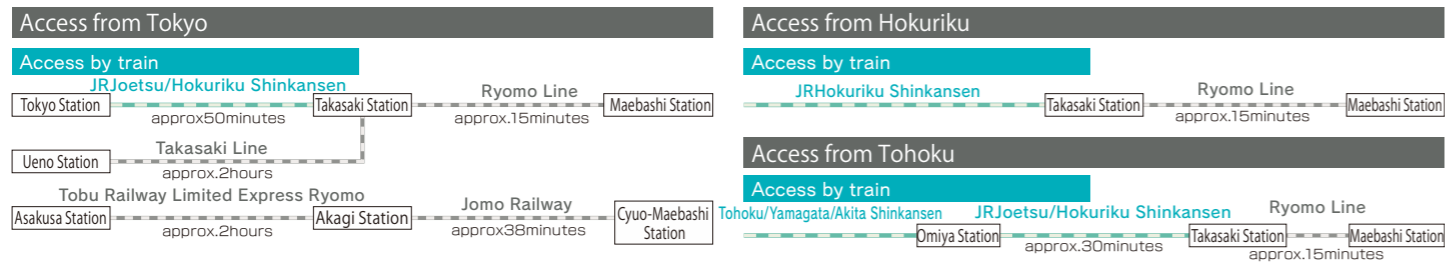

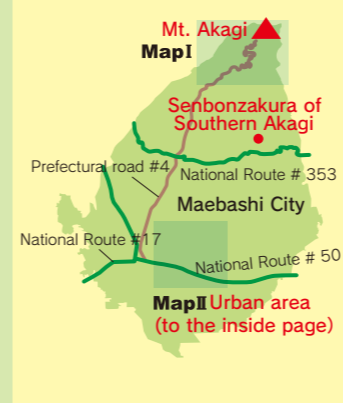

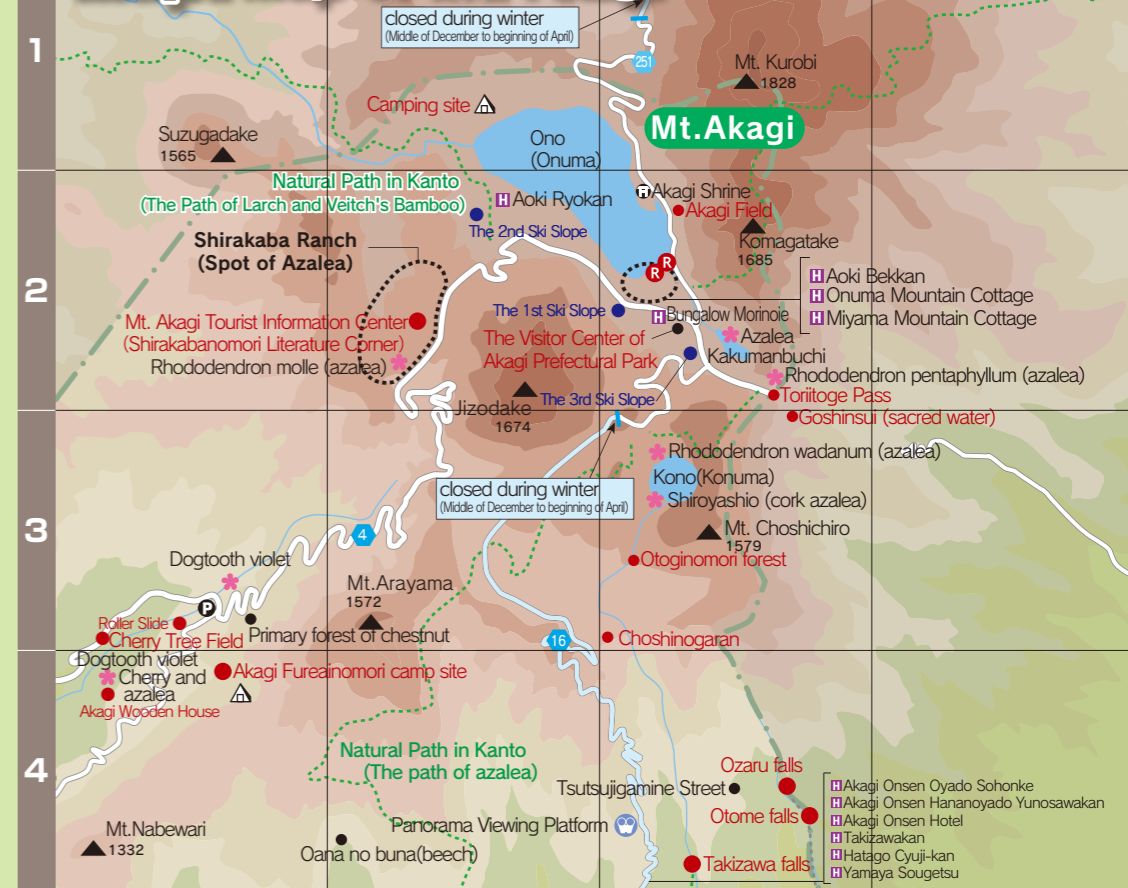
Area Map of Maebashi

The Visitor Center of Akagi Prefectural Park

It is located at the entrance of Kakumanbuchi. The history and current condition of Mt. Akagi are exhibited as well as stuffed animals and plants of the mountain. Shops and eating facility are available.

Mt. Akagi Tourist Information Center

It is located just before the summit of the mountain. Not only sightseeing information, but also a café, shops, and a section where you can learn the history of the writers who are associated with Akagi are available.

Shirakaba Ranch

The ranch spreads on a gentle slope near the summit of Mt. Akagi. Japanese azalea blooming in clumps can be seen in the site from the beginning to the middle of June every year. No admittance to the ranch. "Azalea" is called "tsutsuji" in Japanese.



Kakumanbuchi

A marsh located 1,360 meters above sea level. The circumference is about 800 meters. It is called "Little Oze" for being abundant in hydrophytes and alpine plants. A boardwalk is laid along the perimeter of the marsh.



Climbing field

Mt. Akagi is a collective term for Kurobisán, the main crest and other mountains such as Komagatake, Jizotake, Arayama, Mt. Nabewari, Suzugatake and Mt. Choshichiro. Each mountain is unique and attractive.



Kono (Konuma)

A crater lake formed by volcanic activities of Mt. Choshichiro. It is located 1,470 meters above sea level, in the southeast of Onuma. The perimeter is about 1 km and there is a path along it which takes 30 to 40 min on foot. The tranquil appearance is alluring.



Ono (Onuma)

A crater lake at 1,345 meter elevation, in the peak area of Mt. Akagi. You can enjoy smelt fishing from a boat in fall and on the frozen lake in winter.



Senbonzakura (One Thousand Cherry Trees) of Southern Akagi

A notable spot of cherry trees in Maebashi City, which is designated as one of "Japan's Top 100 Cherry Blossom Viewing Sites".

1 Gunma Prefectural Office
 The 33-story highest prefectural office building in Japan. The 32nd floor is open to the public as a full observation hall. There is a viewing restaurant on the 31st floor, which you can enjoy dining with a beautiful view from daytime to night-time.

2 Rinkokaku
 (scheduled to open after renewal in August 2017)
 Rinkokaku is a modern Japanese style wooden building which consists of Honkan, Bekkan and Chashitsu(tea house). Honkan and Chashitsu were built as a guest palace in September 1884. Bekkan was built in 1910.

3 Maebashi City Museum of Literature
 At this facility, exhibits information materials of Sakutarō Hagiwara, the poet who made a huge contribution to the history of modern-style poetry and other poets who are associated with Maebashi City. There are lots of stelae of poems on the green path along the Hirosegawa river.

4 Arts Maebashi
 At Arts Maebashi, special exhibitions, events, performance projects and educational projects are held. Also, a library of art-related books, a café and museum shops are available.

5 Shopping arcade
 It's a 320-meter-long shopping arcade. It is lined with long-established stores, art spaces and so on.



6 Keyaki Walk Maebashi
 A shopping mall with a supermarket and 150 specialty shops. It also has restaurants and a movie theater. There is a mass marketer of electric appliances in the same site too. (Please note that their opening hours are different.)

7 Maebashi Park
 The oldest urban park in Maebashi City. It has a pond in the shape of Gunma Prefecture called "Sachinoike", a large lawn area, and an amusement park for kids (Luna Park). It is also known as a spot of cherry trees.
 Open throughout the year (except Japanese Garden)



8 Maebashi Souvenir Hall & Tourist Information Center
 It exhibits and sells all kinds of souvenir of Maebashi: craftworks such as Daruma and Kokeshi which were made using traditional skills and modern technologies, the local specialty "Yakimanju" which is made from wheat cropped in Gunma, noodles and sweets made from the regional wheat-flour, and bentos (boxed lunch). Also, the goods of "coroton".
